Pyrotechnic Training

IOM Coastquard offer a facility for mariners to safely dispose of Time Expired Pyrotechnics (TEPs). Occasionally, on collection these are still just "in-date" and can be utilised for Coastguard training. Emergency Port Closure Lights

New Douglas signals have been established at the seaward end of Victoria Pier, which replace the old port signals. They are now situated on a grey mast and consist of three lights, mounted vertically, which display fixed all round red and are visible from Douglas Harbour, Fairway and Douglas Bay. The activation of this signal indicates that the port is "closed" and vessels should not proceed in any direction. All current notices can be viewed at:

Marine Operations Centre Insight

The Marine Operations Centre is one of only a hand full of facilities worldwide, which serve as both Harbour Operations and Coastguard. Each shift is operated by two specially trained officers who are kept fully occupied by duties including controlling vessel arrival and departures, bridge operations in both Douglas and Peel, along with accepting "999" calls and associated response for the Coastguard. The watch constantly monitors Manx territorial waters and the Island's harbours using a range of equipment such as radar, CCTV, AIS (Automatic Identification System) and ICCS (Integrated Communications System). The equipment and systems required to support this service are maintained by a team of technical engineers, who can be called to assist when needed.



Works Update

Salt Works Quay

The new enhanced boat park facilities at the Salt Works Quay in Ramsey are nearing completion. Apart from the resurfacing of the area and stabilisation of the quay wall, additional services include the availability of electric and water to boat owners, which is much improved on the previous site and making it far more useable.

Castletown Flood Defences

The contractors may have only recently started construction of Castletown flood defences, but prior to this the southern harbours staff had already been planning and working hard towards the sizeable logistical task of ensuring the area was ready for construction to begin. The main efforts were focussed on clearing the boat yard which has been temporarily converted into the site depot. This involved a great deal of co-ordination and communications with harbour users. Many took the opportunity to get their vessels into the water for some early summer sailing and others were accommodated in alternative areas. The spirit of the sea going community was evident and we thank all involved for their assistance and co-operation.

Douglas Flap Gate

Douglas Flapgate operates tidally to retain water in Douglas Marina by means of a large gate operated by two hydraulic rams. It is currently undergoing a major overhaul program, the first phase of which has been completed in June. This involved the changing of the first of the two ram cylinders, which has now been dispatched for refurbishment. Therefore, the next phase of work is expected towards the end of the year on its return and a Notice to Mariners will be issued in good time.
